



Reaper Region Control

Reaper Region Control is a lightweight macOS utility for REAPER users who work with regions and want a faster, cleaner workflow.

The app automatically installs a custom REAPER ReaScript and assigns a ready-to-use keyboard shortcut (**⌘⇧R**) to create regions from selected items — without manual setup, action browsing, or configuration hassle.

Designed for musicians, editors, and live performers who value speed and reliability.

Features

- Automatic installation of a REAPER ReaScript into the correct REAPER resource folder
- Registers the script as an action inside REAPER
- Assigns the shortcut **Command + Shift + R**
- Instantly creates regions from selected items
- Supports clean install, update, and uninstall
- Works without license keys, accounts, or online activation

Why this tool exists

Setting up custom ReaScripts in REAPER is powerful — but often repetitive.

Reaper Region Control removes that friction:

no file copying, no action list searching, no shortcut assignment, and no risk of misconfiguration.

Install once. Use forever.

Who it's for

- REAPER users working with regions
- Songwriters and producers
- Editors and podcasters
- Live performers using region-based workflows
- Anyone who wants **one shortcut that just works**

System requirements

- macOS 12.4 or later
- REAPER (standard installation, non-portable)
- REAPER must be closed during install or uninstall

Pricing

Installation Guide

Standard installation (recommended)

1. Quit REAPER
2. Launch **Reaper Region Control**
3. Click **Install / Update**
4. Start REAPER
5. Press ⌘⇧R to create regions from selected items

Done.

Important notes

REAPER must be closed

REAPER must not be running during install or uninstall.
If REAPER is open, the installer will stop and ask you to quit it first.

Non-standard or portable REAPER installations

If REAPER is installed as a **portable setup** (for example on a USB stick) or uses a **custom resource folder**, automatic detection may fail.

In that case:

1. Start REAPER
2. Choose **Options** → **Show REAPER resource path in Finder**
3. Quit REAPER
4. In **Reaper Region Control**, click **Choose manually...**
5. Select the REAPER resource folder shown by REAPER

The installer will remember this path.

First-time REAPER users

If REAPER was just installed and has never been launched before, the resource folder may not exist yet.

Solution:

1. Start REAPER once
2. Quit REAPER
3. Click **Detect** again in Reaper Region Control

Uninstall

1. Quit REAPER
2. Open **Reaper Region Control**
3. Click **Uninstall**

This will:

- remove the ReaScript
- remove the assigned shortcut
- leave your REAPER configuration clean

Troubleshooting

- If automatic detection fails, use **Choose manually...**
- When in doubt, REAPER always shows the correct resource path via **Options → Show REAPER resource path in Finder**
